



STAYING AT HOME IF UNWELL POLICY AND PROCEDURES (STUDENTS)

Staying at Home if you are sick is the best thing you can do to stop any future Spread of Covid-19.

1. As per School Policy, the parents should take the temperature of their child prior to leaving for school. The child should remain at home if they record a temperature of 37.5 or higher.
2. If your child fulfills any of the following criteria, we strongly urge that the child should stay home and do not sent to school.
 - a. If the child feels sick, or if he/she show any of the COVID 19 symptoms like Fever (37.5 or Above), Sore throat, Runny Nose, Cough, Headache, Body pain, Shortness of Breath etc.
 - b. If the child has an international travel history during the 14 days prior to the onset of the symptoms.
 - c. If the child has been in contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case within 14 days.
 - d. If the child is residing in a community setting where COVID-19 cases have been detected.
 - e. If the child has Influenza like illness without history of travel or known COVID-19 Exposure.
3. If a child begins to show any symptoms of Covid 19 while at school, they will be taken to the isolation room. The parent/Guardian of the child will be notified immediately, and the parent should refer their child to the hospital to undertake a mandatory PCR Test. Further, any siblings of the child enrolled at Bright Riders will also need to be removed from school and leave with the parent.
4. The child and siblings will not be permitted to return to school until the child's result for the PCR are obtained and shared with School Clinic.
5. If COVID-19 PCR test is negative, but the child and sibling(s) have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, the child and sibling(s) should complete a 14-day quarantine.
6. If COVID-19 PCR test is positive, the child will not be allowed to return to the School until they have a "**DHA Medical Certificate**" stating that they are free of Covid -19. The DHA Medical Certificate must be provided to School Clinic.
7. If the result is positive, siblings will also be required to take a PCR test before being allowed to return to school.
8. Students with high risk condition (specific illnesses or immunocompromised) are requested to do 100% Distance Learning.
